

DIVISION 6. MECHANICAL CODE

Sec. 14-271. Mechanical Code. With the following additions, deletions, and revisions, the International Mechanical Code, 2003 Edition, a copy of which, authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and City Secretary, made public record by this Section, and on file in the City Secretary's office, is incorporated by reference and adopted as the Mechanical Code of the City of Corpus Christi:

(1) CHAPTER 1, ADMINISTRATION, is deleted. Sections of this article contains the administrative rules for the administration of the Mechanical Code and the other Technical Construction Codes of the City of Corpus Christi, including the Building Code, Electrical Code, Energy Conservation Code, Fuel Gas Code, Plumbing Code, and Residential Code for One and Two Family Dwellings.

CHAPTER 3 – GENERAL REGULATIONS

(2) Section 307.2.1 of the International Mechanical Code is amended by adding an exception to read as follows:

307.2.1 Condensate Disposal. Condensate from all cooling coils and evaporators shall be conveyed from the drain pan outlet and discharge through an air gap or air break into a waste receptor or stand pipe. Condensate shall not discharge into a street, alley or other areas so as to cause a nuisance.

Exception: By the use of a 3 way valve an auxiliary drain pipe may be connected to the primary drain and piped to enable the use of condensate for the irrigation of vegetation and watering of foundation provided the water does not run on other property or puddle.

APPENDIX B – RECOMMENDED PERMIT FEE SCHEDULE

(3) Appendix B of the International Mechanical Code is deleted.
