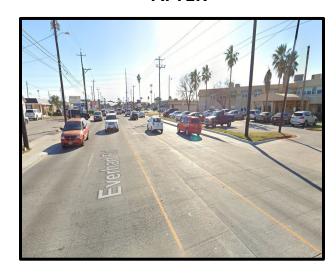

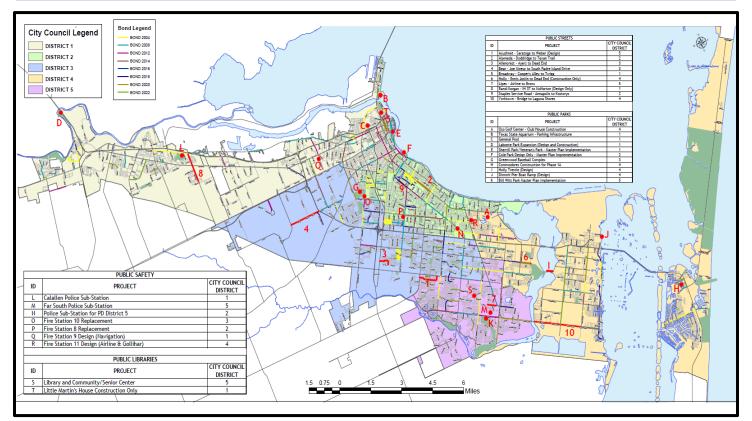

- Debt Service = \$2.6M per year

 - ✓ Stormwater Only Projects = \$600K (25% of debt)

DEBT SERVICE RATIO

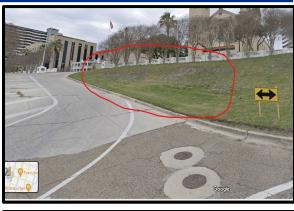

• COST ESTIMATE: \$3 Million

LIMITS: Beach Avenue and Gulfspray Avenue

• **LENGTH**: 0.53 miles

SCOPE: Funding needed in addition to Bond 2018 funds to construct Beach Avenue and Gulfspray Avenue connecting to Causeway in support of \$14.05 million North Beach Drainage project. The North Beach Drainage project is currently at 60% design.

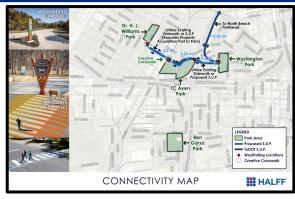

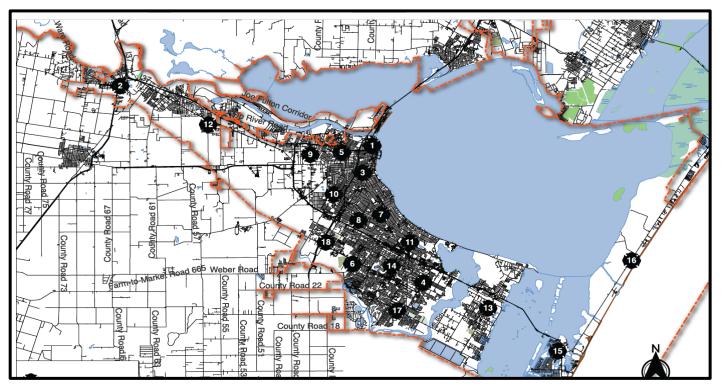

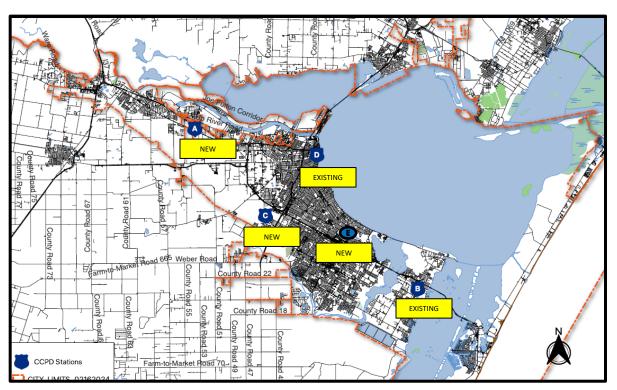

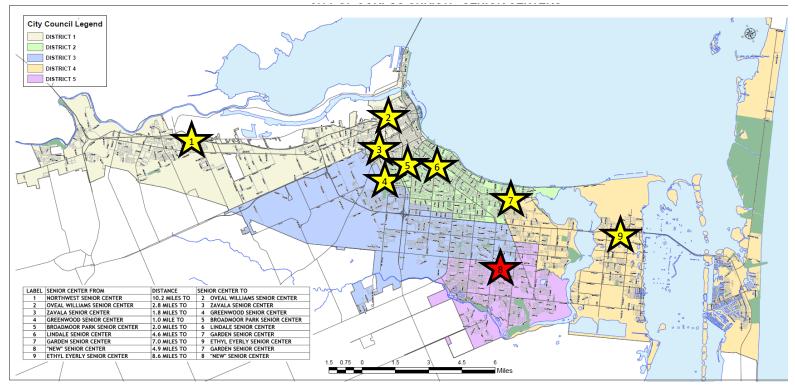








MAP OF CITY'S SENIOR CENTERS
