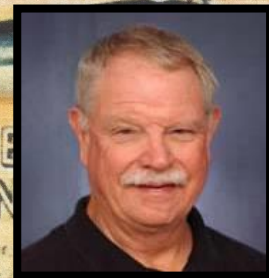
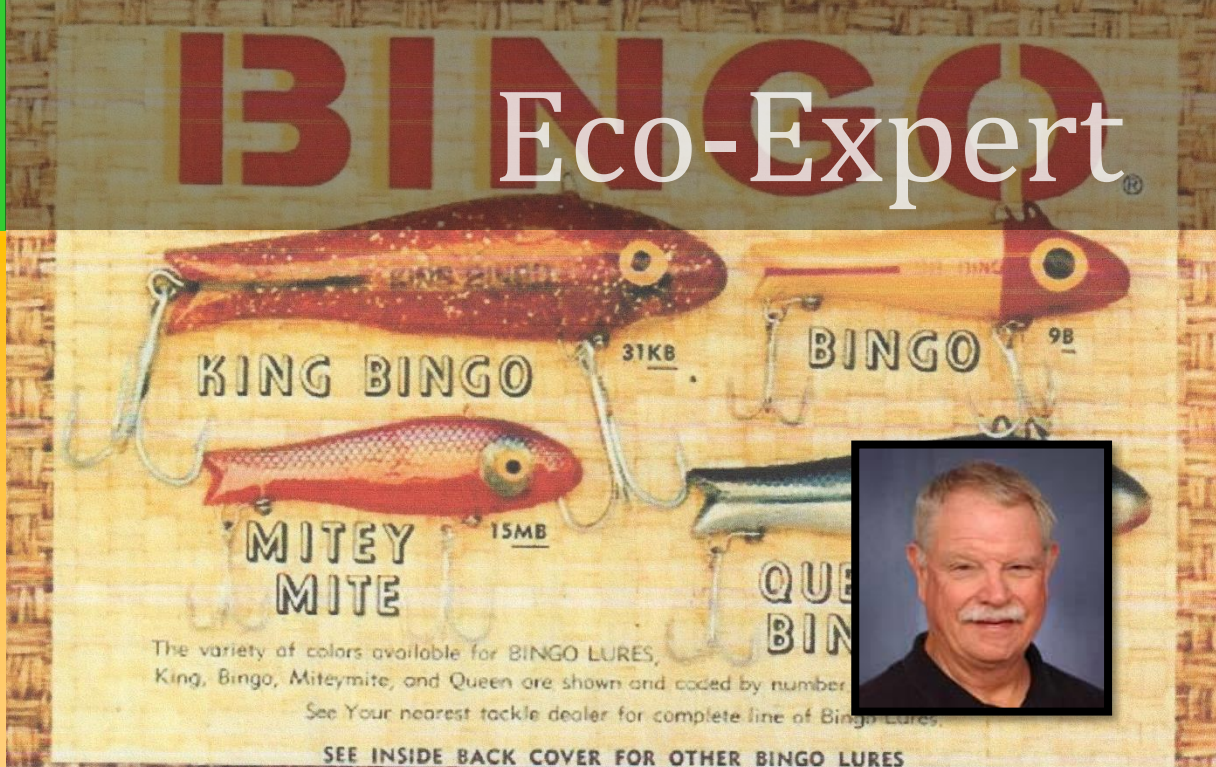

### **Dr. David A. McKee – Author, Professor, & Lure Collector**

For over 40 years, Dr. McKee has been collecting and writing about fishing lures made in Corpus Christi. The companies producing them were largely responsible for the current popularity of using lures in saltwater throughout the Gulf of Mexico and the Atlantic. Several of the companies had their start by men carving lures from wood (and later, from plastic) and peddling them along the Corpus Christi bayfront. His collection numbers in the 1000s and are housed in over 60 hardwood cases. Dr. McKee will give us a vibrant history of lure making in Corpus Christi and bring several display cases with Corpus Christi lures. All lures will be donated to the Corpus Christi Museum of Science & History or to another entity willing to permanently display them for public viewing.
