Ms. Picariello will present about our Texas wild-caught shrimp fishery and how improving gear designs have helped increase sustainability as well as reduce capture of other animals, such as turtles, sharks, and fish. She will explain how turtle excluder devices (TEDs) and bycatch reduction devices (BRDs) work and other fishing practices that make Texas shrimp a great sustainable seafood choice. Shrimp is the #1 seafood eaten in the United States, and the shrimp fishery is the most valuable commercial fishery on the Texas coast. Learn how you can support our local economy and sustainable fishing practices by eating delicious shrimp!
