

STAGE 1 WATER RESTRICTIONS - Frequently Asked Questions

Beginning Monday, July 25th, citations for not following Stage 1 water restrictions will be issued. Citations could result in fines up to \$500 per violation per day. Enforcement will include nights and weekends.

1) Who do Stage 1 Water Restrictions apply to?

Restrictions apply to all city of Corpus Christi residents, including homeowners, apartment buildings, city facilities, commercial businesses, and industry.

2) When and what times of the day can I water?

Watering with irrigation or sprinklers allowed one day per week on your trash day with no watering on that day between 10:00am - 6:00pm. Beginning Monday, July 25th, citations for not following Stage 1 water restrictions will be issued. Citations could result in fines up to \$500 per violation per day. Enforcement will include nights and weekends.

Watering with a hand-held hose with a shut-off nozzle, a bucket, or drip irrigation system allowed on any day at any time.

3) Can I wash my car?

Yes, there are no restrictions to washing your car in your driveway. If you wash your car at home, use a shut-off nozzle that can be adjusted or use water from a bucket. Do not let the water run into the street and storm drains.

4) What about commercial car washes?

Commercial car washes are not restricted at this time.

5) Can I use kiddie pools or rent water slides at my house?

Yes, there are no restrictions on kiddie pools and other water activities within the home. Use best practices to ensure you are conserving water whenever and wherever possible.

6) Can I fill my pool?

Yes, there are no restrictions on filling pools. We encourage residents to cover pools when not in use to reduce water loss due to evaporation.

7) Are there exceptions to the restrictions?

Yes, exceptions for this restriction may be permitted, upon review and approval by the Executive Director of Corpus Christi Water or designee, for the following uses: new plantings (for up to 60 days), vegetable gardens, athletic playing fields, and botanical gardens. 8) What if I have a water well?

These restrictions do not apply to customers irrigating with well water or an aerobic septic system.

9) What is grey water, and can I use it?

Grey water is water that has already been used, typically produced from washing machines, bathtubs, or sinks. There are no restrictions on the use of grey water within the home.

10) What are the consequences of not following Stage 1 Water Restrictions?

A violation is a Class C misdemeanor. Beginning Monday, July 25th, citations for not following Stage 1 water restrictions will be issued. Citations could result in fines up to \$500 per violation per day. Enforcement will include nights and weekends.

11) What about industry?

Some industry and commercial businesses may not use City trash pickup, but they must follow the same guidelines as residents: Watering with an irrigation system or sprinkler is allowed once per week on the City's designated trash pickup day**. On that day, no watering between 10:00am and 6:00pm is allowed.
