Construction Updates

Public Information Signs Posted Along Everhart

This week new public information signs went up in 5 different locations along Everhart Road. These signs include information about how to get in touch with our construction team in the event of questions or concerns. The City's Construction Inspector can be reached by calling (361)-826-3555.



Additionally, the contractor continues to install a 30" sewer line from Bonner Dr. to Holly Road while AEP continues relocating new power poles along northbound Everhart Road from Bonner Drive to Williams Drive.

All work is weather permitting.

Closures included:

- Northbound and Southbound traffic on Everhart Road will continue as one lane for both directions.
- Northbound traffic on Everhart Road, left turns will continue to be allowed at the Holly Road intersection. However, left turns from Southbound Everhart Road traffic will still be restricted.
- The right turn lane on Holly Road will continue to be closed but right turns onto northbound Everhart Road will still be allowed from the right travel lane.
- The east side of Bonner Drive and Everhart Road intersection is still closed. Left turns for both northbound and southbound Everhart Road traffic will be restricted during the intersection closure. Through traffic on Eastbound Bonner Drive will be detoured around the intersection closure.
