Construction Updates

Everhart Phase 1 Moving Forward

This week the contractor and their crew continued with wastewater utility work along Phase 1 of the construction path. This includes the install of a 30" sewer line from Bonner Drive to Cain Drive as well as connecting an 8" sewer line to wastewater manhole number 8.

The crews also cleaned and replaced traffic control barricades in the construction area to ensure that motorists could clearly see business entrances and exits.

All work is weather permitting.

Closures include:

- Northbound and Southbound traffic on Everhart Road will continue as one lane for both directions.
- Northbound traffic on Everhart Road will continue to be allowed to make left turns at the Holly Road intersection. However, left turns from Southbound Everhart Road traffic will still be restricted.
- The right turn lane on Holly Road will continue to be closed but right turns onto northbound Everhart Road will still be allowed from the right travel lane.
- Sidewalks will continue to be closed along Phase 1 until the completion of the project.
- Cain Drive between Everhart Road and Nelson Lane.
