Construction Updates

New Closure Along Construction Path

Wastewater utility work continued this week which included the install of a sewer line. The contractor will begin installing a waterline between Holly Road and Bonner Drive throughout the next few weeks.

Additionally, the east half of the Bonner Drive and Everhart Road intersection is closed to through traffic until further notice.

All work is weather permitting.

Closures include:

- Northbound and Southbound traffic on Everhart Road will continue as one lane for both directions.
- Northbound traffic on Everhart Road will continue to be allowed to make left turns at the Holly Road intersection. However, left turns from Southbound Everhart Road traffic will still be restricted.
- The right turn lane on Holly Road will continue to be closed but right turns onto northbound Everhart Road will still be allowed from the right travel lane.
- Sidewalks will continue to be closed along Phase 1 until the completion of the project.
- Cain Drive between Everhart Road and Nelson Lane is also closed.
- East half of Bonner Drive & Everhart Road Intersection is closed to through traffic.

Construction Project Inspires Business Owner to Work Beyond the Storefront


