



Construction Updates

Temporary Closures Begin Tuesday

Beginning next week, the contractor will start installing a portion of the Phase 2 traffic control plan (TCP). The partial Phase 2 TCP will include a closure of the northbound lane on Everhart Road between Bonner Drive and Curtis Clark. The southbound lane will become two-way traffic.


All work is weather permitting.



Closures include:

- Northbound and Southbound traffic on Everhart Road will continue as one lane for both directions.
- Northbound traffic on Everhart Road will continue to be allowed to make left turns at the Holly Road intersection. However, left turns from Southbound Everhart Road traffic will still be restricted.
- The right turn lane on Holly Road will continue to be closed but right turns onto northbound Everhart Road will still be allowed from the right travel lane.
- Sidewalks will continue to be closed along Phase 1 until the completion of the project.
- East half of Bonner Drive & Everhart Road Intersection is closed to through traffic.

The Palms Nursing and Rehabilitation is one of many businesses continuing their work during the Everhart Road Project. The assisted living center, located at 5607 Everhart Road, provides short-term rehabilitation, long term care, and is also one of the largest care providers of veterans in the Coastal Bend.

Ernest De La Garza is the administrator of the health care facility and he admitted having concerns when the improvement project began. Now, after a few months of construction, he said everything is going well. Drivers follow the traffic plan and folks avoid coming from Holly Road when they are visiting.

According to De La Garza, they are receiving supplies, food, and other necessities daily. He said the new and wider road will make it easier for delivery trucks to enter the parking lot so they can drop off supplies.
