Construction Updates

Phase 2 Traffic Control Installed

This week, the Everhart Road project contractor began the installation of the Phase 2 Traffic Control Plan to include the installation of blue business signs. Next week, the contractor will start street milling and utilities work from Curtis Clark Drive to Corona Drive. The contractor will also begin installing two manholes at the intersection of Curtis Clark Drive.



As part of the completion efforts on Phase 1 of the project, the contractor continues to pour concrete for driveways and sidewalks and will work to complete additional street work between Cain Drive and Everhart Road.

All work is weather permitting.

Closures include:

- Northbound lanes are closed from Holly Road to Corona Drive for construction.
- Northbound and southbound is shifted to the southbound lands (west side), from Holly Road to Corona Drive. Traffic is reduced to one-lane in each direction.
- Northbound traffic on Everhart Road will continue to be allowed to make left turns at the Holly Road intersection.
- Left turns from southbound Everhart Road traffic will still be restricted at Holly Road, Bonner Drive and Curtis Clark.
- Left turns from northbound Everhart Road traffic will be restricted at Bonner Drive, Curtis Clark and Corona Drive.
- The right turn land on Holly Road is closed, but, right turns onto northbound Everhart Road is allowed from the right travel lane.
- Sidewalks will continue to be closed along Phase 1 until the completion of the project. Phase 2 sidewalks will also be closed along the east side of Everhart Road from Bonner Drive to Corona Drive.
- Phase 2 northbound lanes are closed from Bonner Drive to Curtis Clark Drive.


Featured Business
