Construction Updates

Ayers Street Construction Expected to Begin Soon

In partnership with the City, the contractor is finalizing the Traffic Control Plan (TCP) required to move forward with the Ayers Street Pedestrian & Turn Lane Project from South Padre Island Drive (S.P.I.D) to Gollihar Road. The City anticipates the TCP to be approved within a week and construction to begin 1-2 weeks following its approval.

All work is weather permitting.

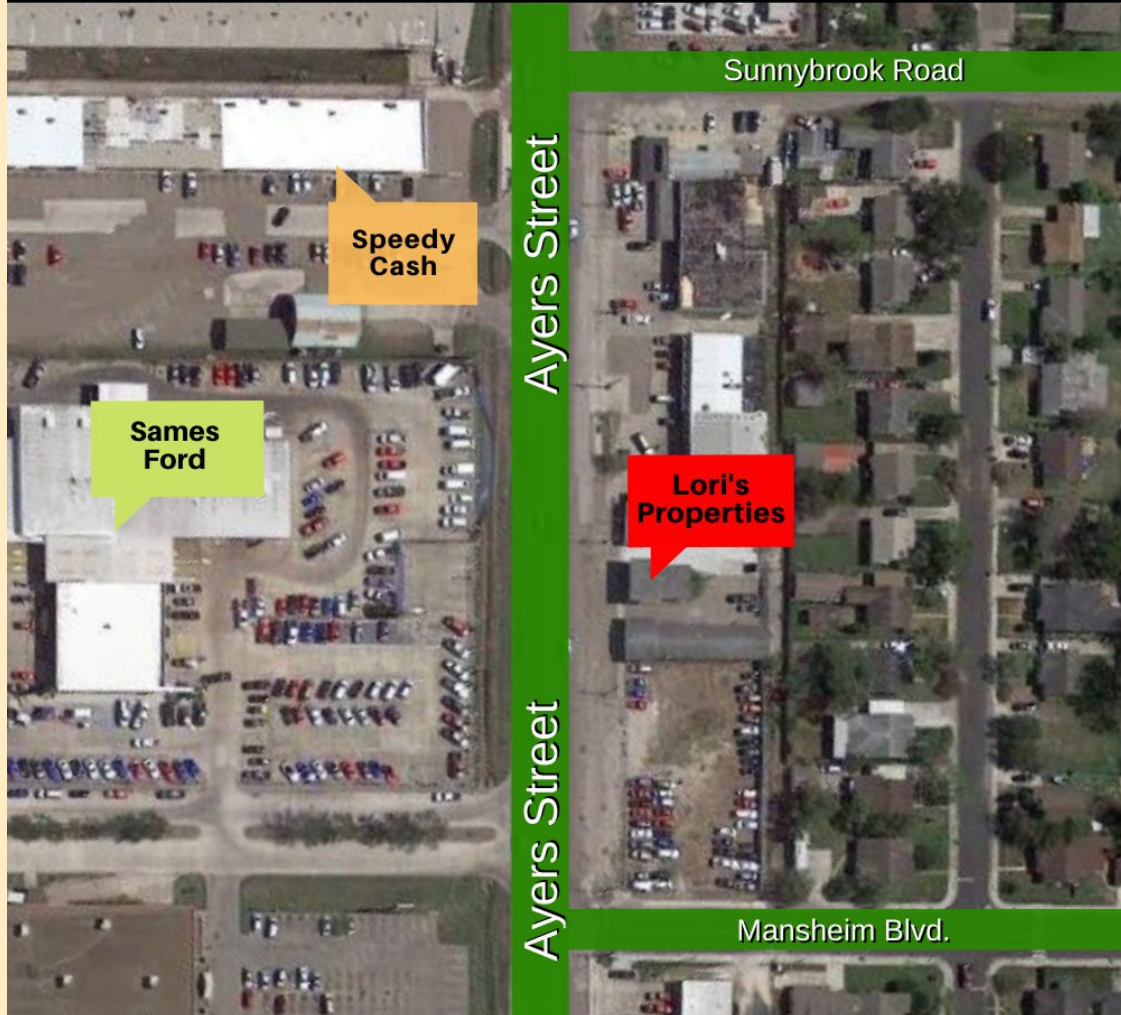
Business Owner Says Road Project is Long-Overdue
