



Online Survey Summary February 3, 2020









About the Online Survey










Survey Participation by Platform Type









How long have you lived in Westside?






How would you rate CURRENT City utilities? (Average Rating)

Feedback Themes

The following information represents general themes extracted from the feedback based on the marker locations and comments made by participants.

Nuisance

Feedback Themes

Excavation pit at S. Navigation Road and Bates Rd.

Homeless near Greenwood Dr., and Gollihar Rd.

Abandoned homes need to be addressed.

Crime is identified in most neighborhoods.

Utilities/Flooding

Feedback Themes

Identified flooding areas are clustered along the western end of Leopard St., near the intersection of Agnes St. and Airport Rd., around the Molina Neighborhood, and near the intersection of Saratoga Blvd. and Greenwood Dr.

Large scale drainage facilities are needed.



Walking/Biking

Feedback Themes

Improved sidewalks are needed across Westside.

Walking paths and sidewalks need improvements in and near parks like Salinas Park

Sidewalks should be improved near schools for safe paths for students to use.

Previous improvements to parks have been good, but further improvements can be made.

Increase the trail network in Westside.

Feedback Themes

Access to the transit system need to be increased in certain areas of the Westside.

Roadway improvements are needed on Airport, Leopard St., Flato rd., Navigation Blvd, Trojan Dr., and Bear Lane.

There is high crime in neighborhood areas.

Better lighting is needed. Better lighting and improved sidewalks along Greenwood Dr. and Trojan Dr. near Moody High School.

Green space and flood mitigation is needed in undeveloped area south of SPID.






Survey Participation by Platform Type



3	Those would help a lot especially during summer and winter to avoid outages




Reduce Stormwater Runoff

#	Feedback
1	Police Columbia ditch from pollution created by the soccer tournaments next to it.
2	Some streets don't have sidewalks like on Quaile dr. and the storm ditch is full of dirt and grass
3	Not sure what this means
4	Increase bio-filtration and bio-retention systems that are integrated into the landscape. These elements should have functional value when not managing stormwater. The stormwater system on the Westside is older and relatively flat. Bio-retention systems that are capable of slowing the rate of discharge into the stormwater system will help make existing infrastructure of longer functional service life and may limit large scale stormwater infrastructure replacement. (See Del Mar College West Campus lawn between Health Sciences and Emerging technology - this is a bio-retention swale that reduces surcharging of the existing city infrastructure)
5	Better drainage
6	More funding needs to be allocated for Stormwater runoff education and outreach.
